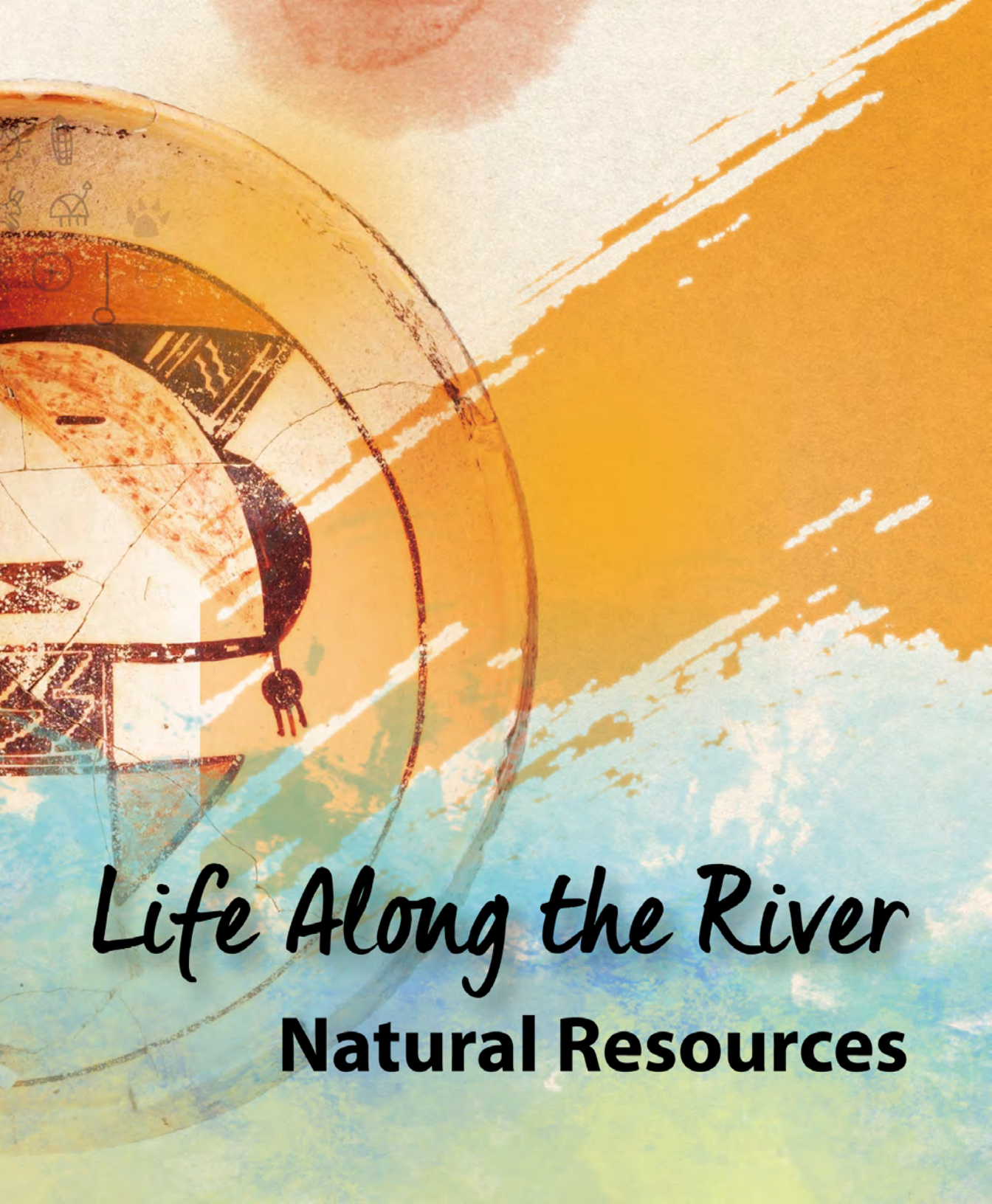

Natural Resources

The Hopi call the Little Colorado River Paayu. Living along the river gave the residents at Homol'ovi access to ample resources that supported their lifeway and the villages grew. Easy access to rare birds and riparian plants and animals, as well as an environment well-suited to growing cotton, likely made Homol'ovi a regional center of exchange. This booklet illustrates some of the animals and plants that the villagers obtained locally and through trade.
